In the summer, there are plenty of places to swim in Iowa County. Daily admission to community pools can range from \$1 to \$3 for children and \$1.50 to \$3.50 for adults. If you plan to swim often, you can save money by buying family season pool passes for \$60 to \$75.

Outdoor Water Activities

Yellowstone Lake

This 455-acre lake is shared by boats, kayaks, canoes, sailboats and other personal watercraft. There are two boat launching ramps and one canoe launch. Yellowstone Lake has a designated swimming beach and a bathhouse nearby. No lifeguards are on duty.

Blackhawk Lake

Nestled in the gently rolling hills of Iowa County, you'll find the perfect get-away for your family, friends, and groups. Blackhawk lake is a slow "no wake", a 500' beach with shower house, and picnic areas with 2 shelters.

Boats and canoes may be rented daily from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day at the Cox Hollow Beach stand. Rentals are also available during the spring and fall. There are launching ramps on both Cox Hollow and Twin Valley lakes. Electric Motors only are permitted on both lakes. Swimming beaches are located on both lakes. Bathhouses are located on both lakes. The beaches are open from 6am to 11 pm, no lifeguards are on duty.

Wisconsin River Boat Launch at Arena

Enjoy the lush landscape as you launch your boat or canoe, picnic, or fish off the banks.

The **Lower Wisconsin River** is a river for people who like to travel and take in the sights at a leisurely pace. Along the entire 92 miles there are no rapids, falls or portages, making the river ideal for recreational canoeists & kayakers.
